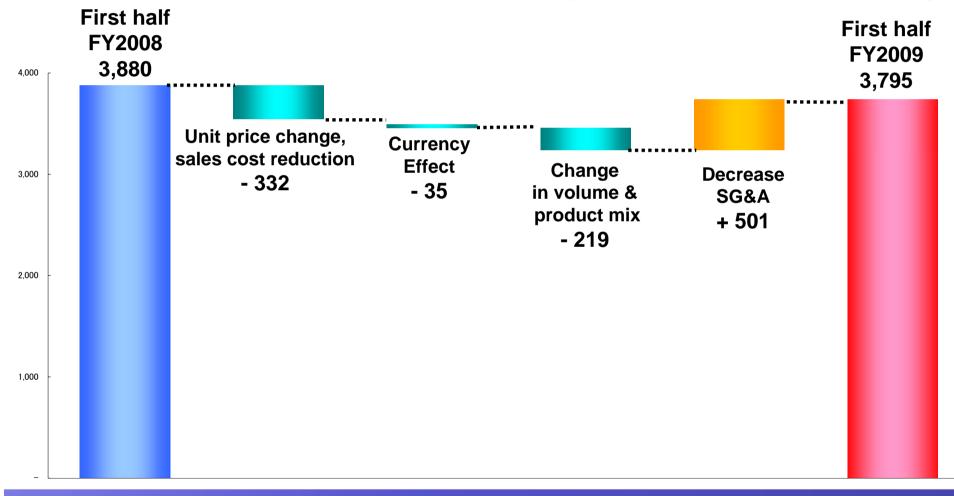

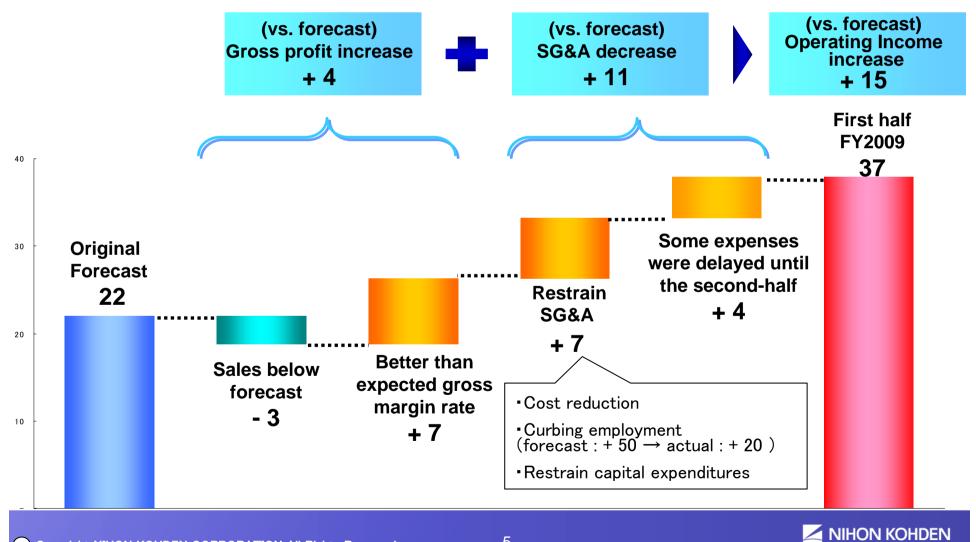
#### 2.1) Breakdown of Operating Income (YoY)

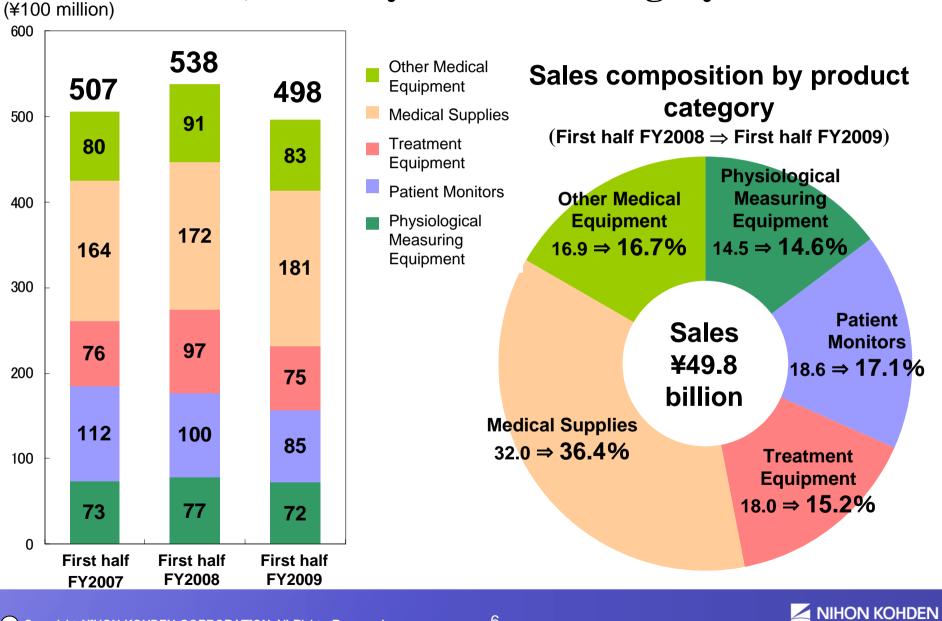


# 2.2) Breakdown of Operating Income (vs. forecast)

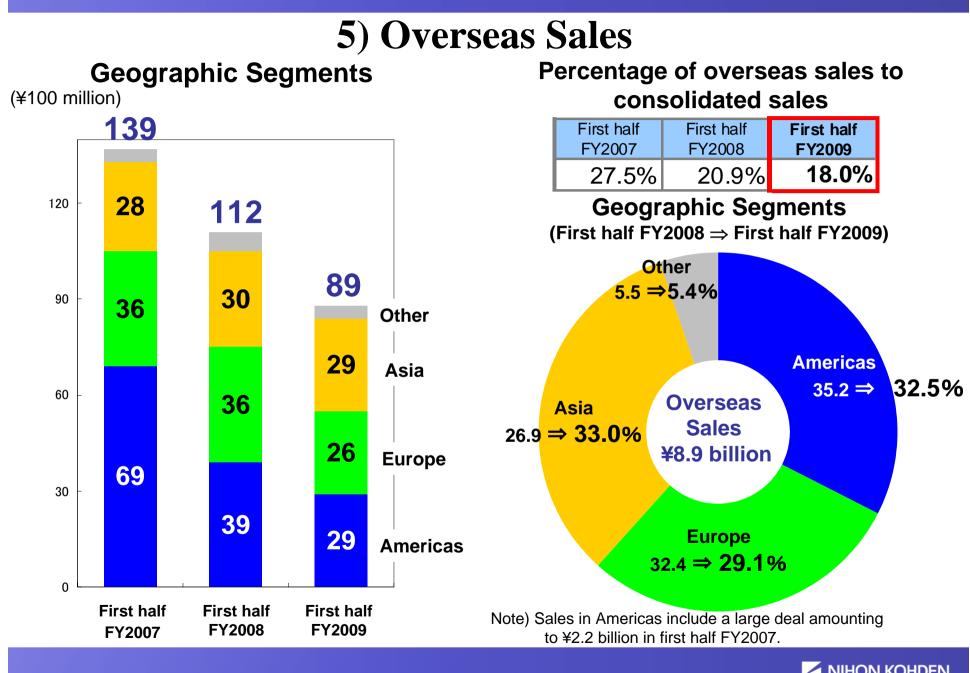
